#### Website Tip of the Month – Registering for Events Online

It's super easy to register and pay for events on the **ONLINE CALENDAR**. Also there are several other ways to get to the event:

- Click on the event in the **Email Bulletin** that is sent out weekly by Joy Simon and you will be taken directly to the event.
- You can click on the event in the **Upcoming Events** listing on the **Members Only** page of the ANC Website.
- Or you can click on **News and EVENTS** on the Homepage. Here you will get a scrolling calendar of upcoming events.

Click on the event that you choose. You will see detailed information about the event. If it is in a "public location" meaning it is not something being hosted at a private home – we will include the address and it will have a Google Map for you.

If you decide to register for the event. Click on the **Register** button.

If you are logged in to your account, it will auto fill the details for you. *Please pay attention!* If your primary account is a two person household – it will auto fill the first field with that two person name (i.e. Diane and Carl Gallagher). If only one person is registering, you need to change it to whoever is registering for the event.

Continue to complete the registration requirements. If there is payment involved it will ask you for your credit card information. Please rest assured, we are using one of the most secure systems available.

Once you complete the process, we have it set up so that the Chair of the Interest Group and, if there is one, the Host will get an email saying you've registered with the appropriate information.

You should receive a confirmation email stating what you've registered for and for how many. Please read the confirmation email and make sure it's correct.

This is a convenient and efficient way to register for events and pay online! You can now do it from any location. A computer, tablet or cell phone.

**Mayfield Park and Nature Preserve** is an island of respite located in the middle of Austin. It is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. This entire estate was presented to the city of Austin in 1971 by Mary Mayfield Gutsch for all Austinites to enjoy as a park. Mayfield Park includes an historic cottage, 2 acres of colorful cottage gardens with towering palm trees, brilliant peacocks and delicate water lilies, all blending in beautiful harmony.
