

Canyon Tour Details: This guided hike is about 1 mile round trip and takes about 1.5 hrs. There is a 125 uneven step staircase built into the natural slope of the canyon landscape. This staircase is the only way to enter and exit the canyon, grotto, and cave area. It is a steep climb back to the top. Once in the canyon there are some additional steps, rocks and roots to navigate as we hike along the trail next to the creek. Some areas have a cable railing to help with balance. I encourage you to bring your own hiking poles/sticks if you question your stability. Bring a camera, water bottle, comfortable clothing for the weather, and supportive shoes.
