It's February, the middle of winter, and what is there to do? Are you looking forward to getting out in the garden and bringing it to life? This month our luncheon program is one you won't want to miss. We are lucky to have a representative from Travis County Master Gardeners to help us get started.

Master Gardeners have impressive credentials. They are members of the local community who have spent 50 hours of training with the Texas AgriLife Extension Service learning everything about plants, landscaping and gardening. They volunteer in the community sharing their knowledge with enthusiasm. Master Gardener Kirk Walden will share his presentation titled **"Native and Well-Adapted Plants: Winning Combinations."** Kirk will have time to answer questions after his presentation.

His presentation will identify that the first step to successful gardening in Central Texas is to choose the right plants. The next step is to combine them in ways so they thrive with each other to present a pleasing palate in your garden space year-round. Garden size, light, water and soil will be taken into consideration. Participants will come away with a list of different ornamental groupings suitable for five different garden sites.

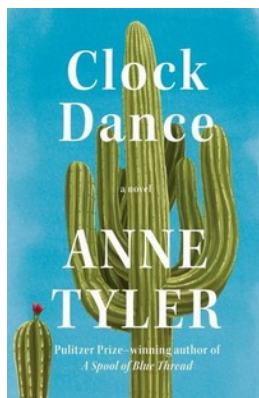

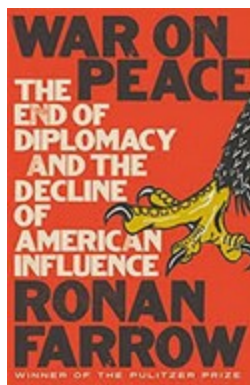

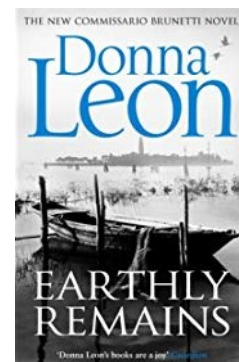
