

Texas Governor's Mansion Tour

Details: The Governor's Mansion, the most historic house in Texas, sits on a beautifully landscaped city block in Austin near the Capitol building. Built in 1856, it is the oldest continuously occupied executive residence west of the Mississippi and it's the fourtholdest continuously operating governor's house in the United States. The Greek Revival-style mansion has been designated a National Historic Landmark. The tour showcases the first floor, and



guests get an insider's look at historical home furnishings, ornate building details, and pieces of Texas history. All visitors must pass a background security screening. We must supply to the security staff all attendees names, date of birth and government identification information at least a week in advance of their tour.
