Learn About One of Austin's Historic Homesteads



Robin Grace Soto, Executive Director of the Flower Hill Urban Homestead Museum, is the speaker for our October luncheon. She will share an interesting presentation about the Flower Hill Foundation.

The foundation was begun in 2004 by Miss Jane Smoot, traveler, citizen historian, longtime AISD English teacher, and last member of the Smoot family as a way to preserve her family home and share it with the world. The Flower Hill Urban Homestead is a celebration of the working class lives of American civil servants, the unsung foundation

of our city and society. By using pieces of the past — including three centuries' worth of furnishings, textiles, and texts; the Texas wildscape, which is home to six historic out-buildings, ponds, and rockeries — the Foundation is establishing an inclusive space. They are working to carry out the late Miss

Smoot's mission to celebrate an Austin founding family of civil servants and preserve one of the city's last historic homesteads.

Mrs. Soto, our speaker, has been working in non-profit management and education for the past 15 years. In addition to serving as the Director of Flower Hill, she is also the Director of Camp Shakespeare at Winedale through the University of Texas. Mrs. Soto also serves on the founding Board of Play's the Thing, which is a program offered to children and their families through Dell Children's Hospital.
