

John Swan, Texas Master Bee Keeper

Pollinating bees are essential to successful plant and food production thoughout the world. Even if you do not have a garden, you can help pollinating bees live in a healthier environment. John Swan will speak to us in March about the importance of bees, and how we can contribute positively to the health of bees.

Mr. Swan is a certified Texas Master Beekeeper and is currently serving as the Vice President for the Texas Beekeeper's Association, and is the Past President of the Travis County Beekeeper's Association (TCBA). TCBA was founded in 2014 and exists to promote common interest and general welfare of beekeeping, to protect honey bees, to educate beekeepers, encourage good bee management practices, and to encourage good relations between beekeepers and the public. The Texas Beekeepers Association was formed in 1880. Its focus, then and now, is about the honey bee, its survival and management. Everyone who cares about the plight of the honey bee and who understands the great need to preserve this master pollinator is welcome to join their Association.



John is the owner of Wicked Bee Apiary where he manages an average 40 honeybee hives, provides training and

consultations for other beekeepers, and hive management services for land owners. From the hives at the Apiary, John produces his unique line of Wicked Bee Honey products. He is also the owner of Wicked Bee Removal Service which was created to help save honeybees from unnecessary extermination by providing live removal and relocation services when bees setup a colony in an undesirable location. Each year this service saves an average of 142 feral honeybee colonies from extermination!

When he isn't playing with his bees, or rescuing other bees, John is talking about bees as the host of The Hive Jive Podcast where he helps educate people about beekeeping, honeybees, pollinators, and their importance. Join us at the ANC March luncheon and learn about bees and the role we play in their world.



The Hico legend is that Billy didn't die in 1881 in New Mexico. Rather, he escaped to Mexico, then to Texas where he lived out his days as an honest citizen

of Hico. There's a book on the subject if you're interested: "Billy the Kid, An Autobiography" by Daniel Edwards. True or false? We'll never really know, but you might find some really interesting clues in Hico!

NOTE: Because the Hamilton Museum can only handle ten visitors at a time, we'll split the group in two (somehow!). Half the group will start at the museum and the other half will start at the chocolate factory. 


