



Season's Greetings! A few years ago our family elected to keep our Christmas Eve dinner simple by ordering pizza. Then on Christmas Day we go all out with our big traditional turkey and dressing dinner with all of the trimmings.

Our favorite pizza parlor in Austin is the iconic Conan's Pizza which opened its doors in May 1979 at the corner of Anderson Lane and Burnet Road at 2438 West Anderson Lane, 78757, phone (512) 459-3221. They also have another location south at 2018 West Stassney and Manchaca, 78745, phone (512) 441-6754.





"The Austin Chronicle" readers voted Conan's Pizza their "favorite pizza in Austin."

Although known for its deep-dish pizza, we prefer the thin-crust "Savage" piled high with sausage, hamburger, pepperoni, green peppers, white onions, mushrooms, black olives, and jalapeños. Hold the anchovies, please.

When Austin restaurants first closed to inside dining in March, Conan's was the first place we ordered take-out. They were grateful for the business. (And we were grateful they were still open.)

Although they deliver, we live outside their service area, so we stop by in person. We can either go inside to pick up our order or let them bring it out to our car.

Now Conan's does have dine-in service available, observing social distancing. Gary and I have ordered "Savages" several times during the pandemic. Following tradition, we will definitely order a "Savage" again on Christmas Eve!

It may be French (look for Champagne, Cremant, or Blanquette de Limoux - all made in the traditional way called Methode Champenoise),

It may be Spanish (look for Cava),

It may be Italian (choose between Prosecco, Lambrusco, Franciacorta, or Asti Spumante if you have a sweeter tooth),

It may be German (look for Sekt), OR

Why not American? (in most cases, the bottle will say "sparkling wine").

There are American "household names" like Korbel or Mumm Napa, or the Top 3 in ratings - Roederer Estate, Schramsberg, and Gruet.

The choice is completely yours.

#### What to expect?

Some pairing suggestions before the event.

Some festive cocktail recipes that you may try in preparation for New Year's Eve.

A brief presentation on the distinctive methods of making sparkling wines, their types, and dryness levels.

An exchange of choices and experiences - when we talk about the types of wine, everybody drinking that type will chime in.

We hope it will be a little learning/ much fun experience.

Team up with another newcomer, invite family members, or just pour yourself a glass. Why not?

All you need is to pick a bottle and CHILL IT WELL (sparkling wines should be consumed the coldest), plus prepare a little snack (for example, salty and fatty potato chips go extremely well with a dry bubbly).

Let's leave this crazy year behind with a loud pop! Cheers.




