If you submitted photos to be processed, then you are welcome to submit four more pictures. Submit your photographs to me (see below). I will confirm the number of photographs that I received from you.

**April 25th**, deadline to request a link to our zoom meeting. Please email your request to me (see below).

**April 27th**, our Photoshare happens at 11:00 A.M. Our meetings last for approximately one hour, but can go longer depending on how many photographs are submitted. We typically start letting people in five minutes early to the Photoshare.
