Austin Pets Alive! pioneers multiple innovative, lifesaving programs designed to save the animals most at risk of euthanasia. This includes the Five-Star Foster Program! These fosters provide a temporary home for the dogs in APA!'s care that may have behavioral challenges that require a bit more management while they await their forever home. Many fosters find it super rewarding to work with these dogs and watch them transform as they learn to trust and live with humans. Five-Star Fosters provide training and socialization for their pups, and manage them in a safe and consistent manner, with continual support from our Behavior Team.

We are all hoping that the Covid

Delta Variant will run its course, soon. But I think that we have to accept that the Covid virus isn't going away. It has changed our reality. Other variants may develop as long as individuals are not immune and provide vulnerable hosts for the virus to grow

Plus vaccine manufacturers develop new Influenza vaccines annually that are designed to combat that year's flu variant.

Then as the vaccines were introduced and folks developed resistance and felt more comfortable having actual gatherings, we thought we were out of the woods. Now we have the Delta variant.

I can tell you that we aren't going to withdraw again, and go back to only Zoom!

The Welcome Mat for September was full of activities and so is this one for October. We know that there is justifiable concern about being indoors around others. Most of us were glad to get vaccinated, but there are members who for various reasons have chosen not to get vaccinated. Even when vaccinated there is some risk of infection. Probably not a risk of serious illness if vaccinated, but there is risk. Knowing that, we still are hoping to do all we can to insure that you feel as safe as possible if you choose to participate in ANC events. We have interesting and varied speakers scheduled to speak each month at the regular monthly

luncheon. I am looking forward to hearing the presentation of Austin Pets Alive on October 20. Chez Zee is working with us to provide an enjoyable but socially distanced luncheon.

Aba

Aba is a Mediterranean restaurant originating from Chicago's historic Fulton Market District. Aba, meaning father in Hebrew, incorporates Chef CJ Jacobson's lighter style of cooking with influences from the Mediterranean, including Israel, Lebanon, Turkey, and Greece. They're located in the mixed-use Music Lane development on South Congress, and there's a large, multi -level patio built around an old oak tree, in addition to a big dining room. Being there was akin to a resort or a vacation spot in the middle of a busy Austin Street.



The service was incredible - our waiter was super attentive, kind

and gave great recommendations. Plates are scaled down portions that are meant to be shared. Variety is the key, and this place certainly delivers. The first time, I sat in the bar area outside and the view was amazing. The second time, there were two couples. We ordered multiple plates to share between the four of us and it was a perfect amount of food. The food was delicious. Highly recommend the Green Falafel with avocado accompaniment. Hummus Platter.... DYNAMITE! The Whipped Feta was on point. The Village Salad had so much flavor, was super fresh and was a surprisingly large plate, which was perfect for the four of us! The Lamb and Beef Kefta was perfect with the hint of lemon and tzatziki. Chicken Kebab was so perfectly seasoned & cooked. Other favorites were the Muhammara and Black Garlic Shrimp.

So, in awe with the set up at Aba. The atmosphere definitely sets the tone for dinner. Peaceful, calm, beautiful both inside and out. This is a can't miss for the Austin Food Scene.

Details: First envisioned in 1998, the Violet Crown Trail, when complete, will stretch 30 miles from downtown Austin/ Zilker Park to Hays County, passing through neighborhoods, greenbelts, and water protection lands. We will explore the

Details: The Turkey Creek Trail could possibly be described as a hidden gem within the city. It is somewhat remote, located in West Austin near neighboring Emma Long City Park.
