Pollinating bees are essential to successful plant and food production thoughout the world. Even if you do not have a garden, you can help pollinating bees live in a healthier environment. At the November luncheon we will learn about the importance of bees, and how we can contribute positively to the health of bees.



John Swan is the owner of Wicked Bee Apiary where he manages an average 40 honeybee hives, provides training and consultations for other beekeepers, and hive management services for land owners. From the hives at the Apiary, John produces his unique line of

Wicked Bee Honey products. He is also the owner of Wicked Bee Removal Service, which was created to help save honeybees from unnecessary extermination by providing live removal and relocation services when bees setup a colony in an undesirable location. Each year this service saves an average of 142 feral honeybee colonies from extermination! Wicked Bee also offers consultation and hands-on training for your hives.

John is a certified Texas Master Beekeeper and is currently serving as the Vice President for the Texas Beekeeper's Association, and is the Past President of the Travis County Beekeeper's Association. When he isn't playing with his bees, or rescuing

> other bees, John is talking about bees as the host of The Hive Jive Podcast where he helps educate people about beekeeping, honeybees, pollinators, and their importance.



Happy Trails

First envisioned in 1998, the Violet Crown Trail, when complete, will stretch 30 miles from downtown Austin/Zilker Park to Hays County, passing through neighborhoods, greenbelts, and water protection lands. We will explore the inaugural section of the trail, opened in 2015, beginning at the Sunset Valley trail head and walking 30 minutes in and 30 minutes out. We will meander down through thickets of Ashe juniper and oak, several water crossings over Gaines Creek (which are normally dry), and ultimately, end with a glorious view of caves and cliffs that are plentiful in the Barton Creek Greenbelt area. On your own time, you now may hike 6 miles from Sunset Valley all the way to Zilker Park. We will be walking a short route. This is sure to be a favorite walking experience for your repertoire. Please bring water, bug spray, and a hiking stick; wear sturdy shoes

Cork and Barrel

If you are heading out to Round Rock there is a nice new restaurant with great ambiance called Cork and Barrel. It is located down the street from Dell Diamond and across the street from Kalahari Waterpark at 4000 E. Palm Valley Blvd.



The owners are friends that set about to start their shared dream of owning a pub. They wanted it to be "as authentically Irish as possible yet infused with local tastes so loved by Central Texans." One is a native of Ireland whose relatives were riveters on the steel hull of the Titanic. The interior combines the history and allure of old Ireland with contemporary technologies.



They have a wonderful outdoor space with picnic tables, a large patio area, a covered pavilion and lots of cork barrels! I saw someone playing cornhole outside

and there was a guitarist playing on the day we visited. They also have a beautifully decorated indoor space with fireplaces and stained glass.

I have eaten there twice. The first time it was on a hot summer day and we sat outside in the pavilion but it was still pleasant

as they had fans. I ordered the charred vegetables and garlic pretzels which come with three dipping cheeses. The Detroit Cream cheese was so yummy and the charred vegetables were delicious! My husband had a Reuben sandwich

and a beer flight which he enjoyed.

The next time we visited we sat inside because we realized they only offer a limited menu on their patio. We had fish and chips which were good and of course I had to get those delicious pretzels again! Some of the other items on their gastro pub menu include red snapper, scallops, prime ribeye, salads and wood fired pizzas. They also have craft beers and a signature cocktail menu.

I really enjoyed this place for the atmosphere and the food was very good. I would recommend making reservations and sitting outside in the pavilion. If you go make sure you check out the family history and plaques by the restrooms.




