Clay Pit

Need a break from the holiday season whirlwind? Try escaping to Clay Pit, a locally owned contemporary Indian restaurant located in the historical Bertram building on Guadalupe Street in downtown Austin.

Recently my husband, Gen Z daughter and I indulged in an Indian feast on a Sunday night at Clay Pit. The restaurant is popular and can get busy, but with its brick-walled track lighting, soft music, and distanced tables, the dining spaces can feel intimate.

Service was attentive throughout our dinner. Mexican Martinis, made of premium Tequila, Rose's sweetened lime, and regular lime whetted our appetites while we scanned the menu.

The Paneer (cheese) Achari Kebob appetizer was mouth-watering. The roasted cheese absorbed the flavors of the peppers and onions around it. We paired it with Cheesy Garlic Naan.



Acting manager Dread (far right), Kaya (center), and Rachel were tickled to be mentioned in the Welcome Mat, giving a "thumbs up" to Austin Newcomers!

The Tikka Masala, in tomato-based butter cream sauce with herbs and spices, tasted delicious to my daughter, who ironically doesn't like tomatoes. The Tandoor chicken and lamb in the Mixed Grill was moist and tender, and the lamb tasted fresh - not gamy, my husband noted. The Khuroos-E-Tursh medallions of chicken breast stuffed with spinach, mushrooms, onion and paneer in a rich korma almond sauce (not over-powering) tickled my taste buds.

The Mango Cheesecake, garnished with mango purée, was light and refreshing. The deep-fried milk pastries were too sweet for me, but perfect for my daughter, who is addicted to Chai.

Consider a visit to Clay Pit as an introduction to the Austin vibe. You'll be pleasantly surprised by their extensive menu and reasonable prices!




