Details: McKinney Falls State Park is 641 acres of historical beauty. It was named after Thomas F. McKinney, a 19th century merchant, racehorse breeder, and rancher who owned and resided on the site. On April 15, 1976, the park was officially opened to the public. The gorgeous upper and lower falls along Onion Creek and various approved hiking paths are among its most renowned attractions, as well as camping sites. We will begin our hike at the Upper Falls near the Visi-

tor Center. A bridge will take us across the creek where a 500-year-old Bald Cypress tree stands - "Old Baldy." We will then follow the Rock Shelter Trail to the Smith Rock Shelter, a limestone overhang utilized by Native Americans for hundreds of years. We will then proceed to a large limestone pad that dates back to the Cretaceous Period, when this portion of Texas was a sub-tropical sea. This trail will lead to the Lower Falls. From there, we will follow a rocky trail along Williamson Creek and then make our way back to the Upper Falls, where we will enjoy our picnic lunches. There are restrooms at the parking area. This hike is in full sun for the most part. Please dress for the weather, wear sturdy shoes, and bring water. Hiking sticks may be helpful on the rocky portion. Please meet in the parking lot near the Upper Falls and Visitor Center (second right after the Ranger Hut) for check-in.

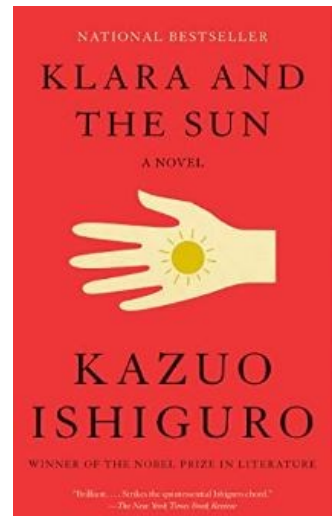

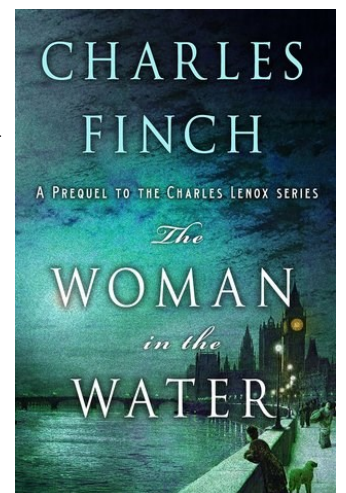

For those of you who don't know and haven't yet been to Bob Bullock Museum of Texas History, six nations have claimed sovereignty of Texas over the decades (Spain, France, Mexico, the Confederacy, the Republic of Texas and the USA). During its tenure as "The Republic of Texas" Texas was considered its own country. Austin, as its capital, was the required posting for a small diplomatic corps. The French Legation building we'll be going to see was, in effect, "The French Embassy" here in Austin. (A more official history will hopefully be im-

parted during our tour.) Almost everyone we talk to seems to have seen the French Legation signage on the side of the I-35 at 12th, but very few have actually gotten there for a tour.

We're going to go and change that. Tickets for the Legation are available at the door via me. (I'll collect your \$4.00 cash and pay with one credit card payment.) After our tour, please consider yourselves invited but not required, to lunch around the corner and up the street at the fun and popular brunch/lunch restaurant, Paperboy, where we'll be ordering from a set menu. Paperboy is located at 1203 E. 11th St., and we can just leave our cars at the Legation and walk over unless it's pouring rain.

Compliments! We'll hope to see you and guarantee beaucoup desie pour toutes!
