Welcome Mayor Steve Adler

We are honored to have Mayor Steve Adler joining us for the monthly luncheon meeting on October 19. As the 52nd mayor of Austin, and the first to serve in the historic 10-1 Council system, Mayor Adler was originally elected in December 2014 and reelected in 2018. Due to term limits, his mayoral service will end on January 5, 2023.

Mayor Adler, along with his brother, were the first in their family to graduate from college. After completing his undergraduate studies at Princeton,

Mayor Adler moved to Austin to work his way through law school at The University of Texas. Like many of us, he fell in love with Austin and has made it his home for nearly four decades.

Mayor Adler practiced civil rights law for many years, and later founded a successful eminent domain law practice representing landowners. He also served nearly ten years as Chief of Staff and General Counsel for Texas

All attendees must be fully vaccinated and boosted.





Marburger Farms is hands down the best, followed by The Arbors show, The Compound show, The Red Barn, Blue Hills and more, more, more. There are 350 vendors at Marburger alone, so I promise that whether you want,: brown antiques; mid century modern; old Chevy trucks converted to wonderful stand alone bars; wicker; architectural salvage; fabrics; belt buckles; cowboy; WHATEVER, you'll find it on October 25th at Round Top. Also, when our grandmothers' furniture temporarily lost its appeal a few years ago, lots of the shows added great jewelry and clothing and accessories to their mix, so now there really is something for everyone.



Round Top's Fall show officially opens on the 24th, but the most fun day of the show, most people think, is the 25th, which is the opening day of the Marburger Farms show where you'll see Joanna Gaines types and other big timedesigners, celebrities, and the super chic.



Because coordinating (herding) a big bunch of us will require a bit of luck and planning, we think we'll start at Marburger half an hour or so after it officially opens. The vendors are all in about 6 huge barns on the Marburger pasture, so

Details: Brushy Creek Lake Park, just north of Austin, is a 90-acre park that includes a 38-acre lake that was constructed in 1965. Details: While the pandemic may be slowing down some and many clubs are starting to meet in a common location so they can intermingle with people, the photography group has chosen to meet via Zoom. Zoom is working well for us and with the ups and downs of different variants of Covid, has been very convenient for us.

We have recently taken a new twist to our format in that we are now having part of our session be a learning session on various aspects of photography. Each session, a member of our group will demonstrate how to do something related to



photography, whether it be shooting or processing. One session was how to shoot a sky and then to import your sky into Photoshop and then make the sky fit your picture. At the time of this writing a topic has not been selected, but if you write to me at the address below, I will be happy to keep you informed of what our sessions are going to be on each

month.

Because so many members of our group enjoy shooting different things, we shoot what we want. Some of our members enjoy having a chal-



lenge. For the month of October it is "Let's replace the sky in our photographs."

Typically October is the second rainiest month in our year. Many will remember that there seems to



frequently be flooding on Halloween in Austin. Thus, one reason to look up to the sky and see if there are any interesting formations to the clouds and then incorporate them into our pictures. Many of the skies are better just before or just after the storm happens. I know that this may not be suitable for everyone especially those who shoot with their phone or iPad, but it helps reinforce what we learned in August about doing sky replacements.

Here are the important dates for our group for the month of October:

October 15th, deadline to submit your photographs to be processed. You are welcome to submit two photographs for other members of the group to process and show you the interpretation they had of your photograph. Every photograph tells a story. How the interpreter tells the story in their mind can be interesting. Submit your photos to me at the address below, and I will send you an email that I received your photographs for processing.

October 23rd, deadline to submit all photographs for our photoshare. Each person is welcome to submit a total of six photographs. If you submitted photos to be processed, then you are welcome to submit four more pictures. Email your photographs to me, and I will confirm the number of photographs that I received from you.

October 23rd, deadline to request a link to our Zoom meeting. Please email me your request.

October 25th, our Photoshare happens at 11:00 A.M. Our meetings last for approximately one hour, but can go longer depending on how many photographs are submitted. Because of the restrictions of Zoom Meetings, we must start at 11:00 so please be prompt.
